#### What is the Central Breach Unit?

- Established 2004 to centralise the breach process
- Prepares breach cases for prosecution for all WA
- Timely breaches
  - = less likely reoffend
  - = more likely to re-engage
  - = less likely to have relocated





#### The Struggle Begins...

#### **Quantitative Questions:**

How many breaches/ how long to process?

• Breach rates: re-offending/non-compliance

male/female

Aboriginal/non-aboriginal

Breach Outcomes:

new orders

fines

custody





#### The Struggle Begins...

A new database is introduced...

Community Business Information System
(C-BIS)

... so too is a significant margin of error

Expected annual change = 2-3%

Margin of error > 2-3%





#### Zeroing in on the Problem

35 data fields (e.g. offender ID, gender, dates, type of breach, ethnicity etc)

- two different data entry screens
- two different data entry times
- two different sets of data entry personnel
- = inconsistent/ incompatible data





### Why Am I Doing This Anyway?

- A practical 'on the ground' contribution
- Promote good governance
- Public accountability





#### I'm Nothing if Not Flexible

#### Re-thinking my evaluation strategy:

- From quantitative to qualitative
- From *impact* evaluation to *process*
- Expanded scope
- "Client" consultation





## **Communication is Everything**

- Logical in isolation
- Nobody looking at the whole
- A symptom, not the cause





#### I'm Not the Expert Here

- The best solutions are often home grown
- Brainstorming solutions
- Have the debates before you make the recommendation
- Consulting up as well as down
