
- □ Apart from recent initiatives (e.g. Landscapes Protection & Biosecurity Victoria), there is little organised evaluation structure at the project delivery levels
- ☐ The 'Evaluation Champion Network Model (ECNM) attempts to build an efficient, self content, sustainable framework to provide evaluation support at project-level
- ☐ This presentation draws on an ECNM that was originally developed for Sustainable Landscapes Portfolio in 2008

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What is the 'Evaluation Champion Network' Model (ECNM)?

- ☐ It is a self-contained, capability building, framework to support project staff and strengthen their evaluation capacity through a mixed-bag of evaluation promoters & 'Champions'.
- ☐ This network:
 - maintains delivering
 - o continuous mentoring
 - o fit-for-purpose evaluation capacity building
 - o sufficient and timely information & support
 - o two-way communication and linkages
 - engaging project staff, stakeholders & intended beneficiaries in the evaluation process
 - using the evaluation results as a tool for intermost industries of services



The Evaluation Champion (EC)?

- □ The Evaluation Champion is a motivated team member, who is voluntarily agrees to dedicate part of her/his time to provide evaluation services/activities for specified projects in her/his region.
- When nominating/selecting a 'Champion', it is preferable that she/he has the following criteria:
 - Experience in project planning and management
 - Willingness to involve in evaluation work
 - Willingness to improve own learning and skills in evaluation
 - Experience in extension techniques and methodology

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Evaluation Champion Role

- ☐ Besides his normal duties, an Evaluation Champion has the following responsibilities; She/He:
 - Contributes to project development, monitoring and reporting
 - Engages stakeholders & project team in developing an 'evaluation plan'
 - Assists projects teams with implementing their evaluation plans and making adjustments when needed;
 - Provides feedback, presenting key evaluation-findings/ results and issues at regular meetings;
 - Attends and contributes to the quarterly 'Evaluation Champions Workshops/Forums', tele- & video- conference sessions and other required capacity building programs and evaluation forums;
 - Liaises with the Evaluation Officer (EO) and the ECs of other regions for assistance and exchange of experiences.

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Support & Assistance Available to the EC

- ➤ Continuous support (Project Manager {PM}) (encouragement, engaging, facilities and resources);
- ➤ Timely one-to-one mentoring and assistance (Evaluation Officer {EO}) (Visits, Tele & Video Conferencing, News Letter, E-mails and Calls)
- ➤ Fit-for-purpose capacity building program (EO, PM)
 (Training-gap survey, regular capacity-building workshops, formal training courses, & Invited Speakers)
- ➤ Participation in internal and external evaluation forums (EO, PM & RPM) (Quarterly Portfolio/Division EC workshops; Evaluation Specialist presentations; & Evaluation Community of Interest meetings)

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The Project Manager - Role & Responsibilities

- ☐ The PM has an essential role in supporting the ECs and enabling them to fulfil their tasks. To this end, the PM:
 - ➤ Identifies/nominates, motivates and provides support to the ECs in her/his region
 - > Engages the EC in project planning, review and reporting
 - Facilitates effective and efficient implementation of project evaluation plans through liaising with the ECs
 - Maintains integrity of the project activities and achievements with the key-project objectives/milestones
 - Liaises with the Evaluation Officer and the Regional Project Manager, to build an 'evaluation thinking' among her/his team members through:
 - Incorporating 'project evaluation activities' as a regular agenda item in the team meetings
 - o Inviting evaluation case studies from other regions
 - o Inviting evaluation professional speakers

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Role & Responsibilities of the Regional Evaluation Officer

- ☐ The Evaluation Officer has a vital role of facilitating the implementation of the model. He/she:
 - ➤ Coordinates evaluation activities of the Portfolio/Division
 - Provides timely assistance and mentoring to the assigned ECs
 - Identifies training/capability-building needs for the assigned ECs and coordinates relevant actions
 - Facilitates dynamic linkages between the model main players
 - > Enhances 'evaluation culture' attitude among staff through
 - Provides regular updates to the EQAU on the status of projects evaluation activities, achievements, recommendations and concerns
 - Develops annual evaluation reports for respective Key Projects (engaging the Key project Managers and the RPMs)



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Evaluation and Quality Assurance Unit (EQAU)

- ☐ The EQAU is a committee of professionals. It oversees and coordinates Portfolio/Division project and program management and evaluation including quality assurance.
- ☐ The Unit consists of the Key Project Managers (KPMs), the RPMs, the EO and other designated professionals (e.g. Climate Change Officer) Plus Stakeholders representatives. The EQAU:
 - > maintains high-quality project & key project management and evaluation
 - maintains effective and efficient integration between project outputs and respective key-project's milestones
 - maintains integrity of own Portfolio/Division outputs with outputs of other Portfolios/Divisions
 - maintains a dynamic linkage with the key stakeholders
 - produces quality project and key project evaluation reports

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
