





Assumptions
Examples of planning assumptions:

- •The thresholds for success/failure what degrees of each are acceptable:
- How our intervention will be perceived by locals and the surrounding region; + Legitimacy
- The primary issue to be resolved;
- Interdependencies and + Capacity flow-on effects;
- Our own capabilities and influences.

### Identifying & evaluating them together
