ONLINE GROUP MENTORING

Multi-directional relationships – mentors and peer group

Flexible and lower-pressure

Guided exploration

Not didactic

The social contract matters

Structured around themes

Inclusive across locations

Builds reflective practice

Can be less goaloriented than 1:1 mentoring
