





- Advocate for change







5-Principles


- Safety

Gathering information from other sources before interviewing evaluation participants

Acknowledging past and ongoing trauma


Comprehensive cultural safety training - ongoing process

- Critical reflection









- Evaluation commissioners










Accessible Data Collection
